9. REPORTS

A. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Chief Administrative Officer Howie reported that January 2026 marks the start of the second year of the current two-year legislative session, with the legislature reconvening earlier in the month and bill introductions underway through late February. A key proposal under discussion involves utility identification legislation being developed with a coalition of the Public Water Agencies Group and Senator Archuleta to improve utility worker access to emergency sites, particularly during disaster response. The proposal is being reviewed by ACWA and CSDA and is awaiting formal bill introduction. The update also covered the current Democratic supermajority in both legislative houses, the upcoming gubernatorial election due to Governor Newsom being term-limited, and the release of the Governor's proposed budget. The budget projects a \$2.9 billion deficit compared to an \$18 billion estimate by the Legislative Analyst's Office, with further clarity expected in May. Upcoming

advocacy efforts include the annual Lobby Day at the Capitol on March 3, participation in the San Gabriel Valley Economic Partnership Lobby Day on February 24, and a scheduled meeting with Assemblymember Michelle Rodriguez.

B. WATER SUPPLY UPDATE

Chief Water Resources Officer Lee reported that there was no change to the State Water Project allocation, which remains at 10 percent. The Department of Water Resources is expected to provide an updated allocation following its February snow survey. The allocation is anticipated to increase to at least 35 percent or higher, which would make additional water available for groundwater replenishment programs where capacity exists. MWD's current supply and demand analysis shows an apparent shortfall of approximately 315,000 acre-feet at the 10 percent allocation level. This does not represent an actual shortage due to MWD's more than 3.8 million acre-feet of water in storage, which can be used to meet demand as needed.

C. PROJECTS UPDATE

Engineer Panzer provided an update on the PM 21 bypass meter upgrade, which involves installing a smaller meter at the main influent meter location to improve measurement accuracy during low-flow conditions and reduce unaccounted-for water. The project is being constructed by MWD using its internal crews, with installation scheduled during the March 4 shutdown and completion anticipated by the end of the fiscal year.

Bids were received and are under review for the Well No. 2 Variable Frequency Drive (VFD) replacement project. The existing VFD has reached the end of its useful life and is currently out of service, prompting a proactive replacement with newer, more efficient technology. Staff will recommend awarding the project at the Board meeting next month.

Phase 1 of the Miramar Administration Building upgrades, focused on roof replacement, is approximately 75% complete, with construction having begun in early December. The project remains within the \$1.7 million Phase 1 budget, with additional costs covered by contingency due to necessary unforeseen structural, seismic, and safety repairs discovered during construction.

The Acid Feed System Replacement project will replace the aging system originally designed for sulfuric acid and now used for EarthTec. The \$1.2 million project will add a remote upstream injection point near the PM 21 meter to enhance plant-wide protection and support golden mussel mitigation. The project is budgeted at \$200,000 this fiscal year for design and the remaining construction costs planned for a future budget cycle.

10. DIRECTORS' / GENERAL MANAGER'S ORAL REPORTS

General Manager Litchfield reported that at the upcoming Six Basins Watermaster Board meeting next week, Three Valleys, Stetson Engineering, and Watermaster will brief the Board on golden mussel-related challenges affecting recharge operations in the main San Gabriel Basin and outline proposed mitigation measures. In addition, the MWD Diamond Valley Lake Inspection trip will be held in March.

Director De Jesus reported that the ad hoc committee met in January to discuss the Colorado River Aqueduct negotiations. While progress remains gradual, there is growing optimism that the seven basin states will reach consensus on a framework that could lead to a long-term agreement, potentially structured as a five-year initial term with checkpoints extending up to a 20-year period.

Director Hanlon stated that based on guidance from West Yost, the Six Basins facilities are currently at capacity and additional pumping will be needed to create storage space for future recharge.

3. PUBLIC COMMENT

President Ti opened public comment and there was none.

4. BOARD OF DIRECTORS WORKSHOP

Retiree Medical Program

Chief Finance Officer Gomez presented an overview of proposed enhancements to the District's retiree medical benefits, building on the retiree medical policy approved by the Board of Directors on December 17, 2025, and effective January 1, 2026, for future retirees.

The presentation summarized Board feedback received in December; and outlined enhancement scenarios evaluated for affordability and actuarial impact. All proposed scenarios include a \$1,000 initial monthly benefit, the option to secure medical, dental and vision coverage through the District, a Tier 1 vesting schedule of 10 to 15 years, and a 2.5% annual escalator with no termination date. Staff recommended Scenario 1 as the lowest-cost enhanced option, emphasizing cost control measures, and spousal use of unused benefits.

The Board directed staff to return this item to the February 4, 2026 Board of Directors meeting for consideration and approval of Scenario 1, which would repeal and replace the December 17, 2025 retiree medical policy, effective January 1, 2026, for future retirees. Furthermore, the Board directed staff to review retiree medical benefits every three years in conjunction with the salary survey.

Organizational Changes

Human Resources/Risk Manager Robles presented proposed organizational restructuring and succession planning changes to support the upcoming retirement of the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO), and address the District's long-term operational, technological, and leadership needs. The CAO position currently encompasses Administrative Leadership & Oversight; Legislative & External Affairs; and Communication, Education, & Conservation Programs. Upon the CAO's retirement, duties will be redistributed through the creation of a Government Affairs Manager and a Water Resources Specialist, with the existing Administrative & Communications Assistant transitioning into the Water Resources Specialist position. The proposed restructuring related to the CAO transition results in an estimated annual savings of \$72,000.

A SCADA Electrical Technician will be added to address emerging cybersecurity and infrastructure requirements identified through the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency assessment. The anticipated start date for this position is January 2027 and a fiscal impact of \$170,000.

The Board expressed support for the proposed organizational changes and directed staff to return this item to the February 4, 2026 Board of Directors meeting for consideration and approval.

President Ti thanked staff and the Board for the presentation and discussion and recommended future workshops for compensation studies and benefit-related discussions.




Sector Allocation


Maturity Distribution



Subject: Award Contract for Well No. 2 Variable Frequency Drive Replacement Project

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Board of Directors award the Well No. 2 Variable Frequency Drive Replacement construction contract to Leed Electric, Inc. for an amount not to exceed \$327,903 and authorize the General Manager to execute the contract, subject to non-substantive changes.

Discussion

The existing Well 2 variable frequency drive [VFD] was installed in 2013 and has been in service for 12 years. The VFD is necessary to operate the well efficiently by reducing power consumption, maintaining steady pressure, and improving automated control through SCADA. The current unit is based on legacy diode-bridge technology and is no longer supported by the manufacturer, limiting the availability of replacement parts and technical service. A failure of the existing VFD would result in an unplanned outage and render Well 2 inoperable until a replacement drive can be procured. Replacement of the Well 2 VFD is a proactive reliability upgrade to mitigate risk of downtime and to improve operational performance and energy efficiency through modern drive technology.

The Project scope of work includes removal and replacement of the Well 2 variable frequency drive, the NEMA 3R VFD enclosure, installation of required electrical appurtenances, and integration into the existing Well 2 equipment. The proposed replacement will be an active front-end VFD in lieu of the existing diode VFD, improving energy efficiency and reliability.

The project was advertised through the District's PlanetBids portal, resulting in two (2) responsive bids. A summary of the bids received is included below.

Bids Received	Cost
Leed Electric, Inc.	\$327,903
Estate Design and Construction	\$449,000
Engineer's Estimate	\$366,000

Staff have reviewed the documentation and experience of the apparent responsive low bidder and have determined that all requirements have been met. Minor irregularities in the bid are deemed non-material and are waived. Staff recommends that the Board of Directors award the construction contract to Leed Electric in the not to exceed amount of \$327,903.

Fiscal Impact

The Fiscal Year 2025–26 Budget includes \$200,000 for Well 2 Equipping Project. Budget transfer in the amount of \$150,000 is proposed to be completed from the Administration Building Improvements project, which received construction bids significantly lower than the original cost estimate. The reallocation of the budget will result in a new total project budget of \$350,000 for the Well 2 Equipping Project.

The proposed contract award of \$327,903 is within the revised project budget and will not result in any fiscal impact to the adopted FY 2025–26 Budget.

SECTION D - CONTRACT AND RELEVANT DOCUMENTS

1.0 CONTRACT

THIS CONTRACT, made and entered into this 18th day of February, 2026, by
and between Leed Electric, Inc. .

hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR," and Three Valleys Municipal Water District located in Los Angeles, California, hereinafter referred to as "TVMWD".

WITNESSETH:

That for and in consideration of the promises and agreements hereinafter made and exchanged, TVMWD and the CONTRACTOR agree as follows:

- A. CONTRACTOR agrees to perform and complete in a workmanlike manner, all Work required under these Bid Documents FOR WELL 2 VFD REPLACEMENT, in accordance with the Bid Documents, and to furnish at their own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, tools, and services necessary, except such materials, equipment, and services as may be stipulated in said Bid Documents to be furnished by TVMWD, and to do everything required by this Contract and the said Bid Documents.
- B. For furnishing all said labor, materials, equipment, tools, and services, furnishing and removing all plant, temporary structures, tools and equipment, and doing everything required by this Contract and said Bid Documents; also for all loss and damage arising out of the nature of the Work aforesaid, or from the action of the elements, or from any unforeseen difficulties which may arise during the prosecution of the Work until its acceptance by TVMWD, and for all risks of every description connected with the Work; also for all expenses resulting from the suspension or discontinuance of Work, except as in the said Bid Documents are expressly stipulated to be borne by TVMWD; and for completing the Work in accordance with the requirements of said Bid Documents, TVMWD will pay and said CONTRACTOR shall receive, in full compensation therefore, the price(s) set forth in this Contract.
- C. That TVMWD will pay the CONTRACTOR progress payments and the final payment, in accordance with the provisions of the Contract Documents, with warrants drawn on the appropriate fund or funds as required, at the prices bid in the Bidding and Contract Requirements, Section C – BID FORMS and accepted by TVMWD, and set forth in this below.

- D. TVMWD hereby employs the CONTRACTOR to perform the Work according to the terms of this Contract for the above-mentioned price(s), and agrees to pay the same at the time, in the manner, and upon the conditions stipulated in the said Bid Documents; and the said parties for themselves, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, do hereby agree to the full performance of the covenants herein contained.
- E. The Notice Inviting Bids, Instructions to Bidders, Bid Forms, Information Required of Bidder, Performance Bond, Payment Bond, Contractor's License Declaration, Specifications, Drawings, all General Conditions, Special Conditions and all Project Requirements, and all Addenda issued by TVMWD with respect to the foregoing prior to the opening of bids, are hereby incorporated in and made part of this Contract, as if fully set forth.
- F. The CONTRACTOR agrees to commence Work under this Contract on or before the date to be specified in a written "Notice To Proceed" and to complete said Work to the satisfaction of TVMWD **One hundred Eighty (180) calendar days** after Award of the Contract. All Work shall be completed before final payment is made.
- G. Time is of the essence on this Contract.
- H. CONTRACTOR agrees that in case the Work is not completed before or upon the expiration of the Contract Time, damage will be sustained by TVMWD, and that it is and will be impracticable to determine the actual damage which TVMWD will sustain in the event and by reason of such delay, and it is therefore agreed that the CONTRACTOR shall pay to TVMWD the amounts as set forth in General Conditions, Section C – CHANGES TO THE CONTRACT for each day of delay, which shall be the period between the expiration of the Contract Time and the date of final acceptance by TVMWD, as liquidated damages and not as a penalty. It is further agreed that the amount stipulated for liquidated damages per day of delay is a reasonable estimate of the damages that would be sustained by TVMWD, and the CONTRACTOR agrees to pay such liquidated damages as herein provided. In case the liquidated damages are not paid, the CONTRACTOR agrees that TVMWD may deduct the amount thereof from any money due or that may become due to the CONTRACTOR by progress payments or otherwise under the Contract, or if said amount is not sufficient, recover the total amount.
- I. In addition to the liquidated damages, which may be imposed if the CONTRACTOR fails to complete the Work within the time agreed upon, TVMWD may also deduct from any sums due or to become due to the CONTRACTOR, penalties and fines for violations of applicable local, state, and federal law.

- J. That the CONTRACTOR shall carry Workers' Compensation Insurance and require all subcontractors to carry Workers' Compensation Insurance as required by the California Labor Code.
- K. That the CONTRACTOR shall have furnished, prior to execution of the Contract, two bonds approved by TVMWD, one in the amount of one hundred (100) percent of the Contract Price, to guarantee the faithful performance of the Work, and one in the amount of one hundred (100) percent of the Contract Price to guarantee payment of all claims for labor and materials furnished.
- L. 





1. The negotiated exchange of property tax revenues resulting from the annexation of territory to County Sanitation District No. 22 in the annexation entitled Annexation No. 449 is approved and accepted.

2. For each fiscal year commencing on and after July 1, 2025, or after the effective date of this jurisdictional change, whichever is later, the County Auditor shall transfer to County Sanitation District No. 22 a total of 0.5483181 percent of the annual tax increment attributable to the land area encompassed within Annexation No. 449 as shown on the attached Worksheet.

3. No additional transfer of property tax revenues shall be made from any other tax agencies to County Sanitation District No. 22 as a result of annexation entitled Annexation No. 449.

4. No transfer of property tax increments from properties within a community redevelopment project, which are legally committed to a Community Redevelopment Agency, shall be made during the period that such tax increment is legally committed for repayment of the redevelopment project costs.

5. If at any time after the effective date of this resolution, the calculations used herein to determine initial property tax transfers or the data used to perform those calculations are found to be incorrect thus producing an improper or inaccurate property tax transfer, the property tax transfer shall be recalculated and the corrected transfer shall be implemented for the next fiscal year.



RE: Legal Update – Annual Sunshine Ordinance Review

The purpose of this memorandum is to advise the Board with respect to newly-applicable statutory and regulatory developments concerning the above-referenced matter.

Senate Bill 707

On October 3, 2025, Governor Gavin Newsom signed Senate Bill (“SB”) 707 into law. As a result, beginning January 1, 2026, local agencies across California must now comply with the most extensive revamp of the Ralph M. Brown Act, Government Code Sections 54950-54963 (“Brown Act”), in the entire 72-year existence of the so-called “sunshine law” legislation.

As such, enclosed herewith please find copies of the *Brown Act Compliance Manual and Statutory Reference Table* prepared by the California Special Districts Association which describes in detail the Brown Act revisions effectuated by SB 707. Even though the District does not qualify as an “eligible legislative body” subject to the more extreme provisions of SB 707, the District must still satisfy all of the following new requirements of the Brown Act which are briefly discussed below:

A. Mandatory Distribution of the Brown Act to Board Members.

The District must provide every Board member with a full copy of the Brown Act. District staff has already completed this task by e-mail to the Board dated January 8, 2026.

B. Teleconference Rules for Board Members with Disabilities.

On July 24, 2024, California Attorney General Rob Bonta issued Opinion No. 23-1002 which concluded that the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, 42 U.S.C. Sec. 12132 (“ADA”), requires a local agency’s legislative body to allow a member’s remote participation from a non-public location as a reasonable accommodation for a qualifying director whose disability precludes his or her in-person attendance, subject to the requirements of the ADA. In addition,

the Attorney General determined that any member of a legislative body participating remotely as a “reasonable accommodation” is required to comply with the following two requirements: (1) use two-way video and audio streaming in real time and (2) disclose the identity of any adults who are present with the member at the remote location.

SB 707 codifies that a Board member may participate remotely as a reasonable accommodation for a disability. In that case, the District does not meet the following “classic” conditions set forth in Government Code Section 54953(b):

- (i) A quorum of the body must participate from location with the local agency’s jurisdiction, but other members may participate from outside the jurisdiction;
- (ii) The remote location(s) must be connected to the main meeting location by telephone, video, or both;
- (iii) The notice and agenda for the meeting must identify the remote location(s);
- (iv) The remote location(s) must be posted and accessible to the public;
- (v) All votes must be by roll call; and
- (vi) The meeting must otherwise comply with the Brown Act, which includes allowing participation by members of the public present in remote location(s).

However, the Board member must use both audio and video (unless his/her disability requires participation off-camera) and must disclose before any action is taken whether any adults are present in the room and their relationship.

C. Changes to “Just Cause” Remote Participation Rules.

District-sponsored Assembly Bill (“AB”) 2449, which was successfully enacted into law on September 13, 2022, added Government Code Section 54953(f) to the Brown Act until January 1, 2026, which allowed for remote participation by Board members in the event of “just cause” or “emergency circumstances” as defined therein.

SB 707 merges prior “just cause” and “emergency circumstances” rules into a single “just cause” exception, effective through January 1, 2030. Remote participation for “just cause” continues to include contagious illness, family medical emergencies, childcare/caregiving obligations, travel while on official District or other agency business, and other qualifying health reasons, and will not also include certain military service obligations, and having an immunocompromised family member that requires the Board member to participate remotely. Restrictions include annual limits on use (i.e., five times a year for legislative bodies like the Board that regularly meet twice a month), advance notice to the Board, required audio/visual participation, and a quorum physically present at the meeting location.

D. Changes to Emergency Teleconferencing Rules.

Under AB 557, which took effect on January 1, 2024, the Board had the ability to attend meetings remotely in the event of a State-declared emergency which resulted in the Board determining by a majority vote that meeting in-person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees due to the emergency.

SB 707 recasts this exception for remote meetings during a state of emergency to now include recognition of local emergencies declared by the District itself, as well as statewide emergencies.

E. Social Media Rules.

SB 707 continues the social media rules in the Brown Act which had set to expire on January 1, 2026. Under those rules, Board members may use social media to discuss District matters, provided that a majority does not engage on the topic. No Board member may respond to, react to (e.g., “like” or “dislike”), or re-post another Board member’s content. In practice, when one Board member posts on social media where all are present, the other must stay silent.

F. Clarity Regarding Oral Report of Executive Compensation.

The existing Brown Act rule that the Board must make an oral report prior to taking action on compensation of a local agency executive, has not been expanded by SB 707 to include departments heads and other similar administrative officers.

G. Clarity Regarding Right to Remove Disruptive Individuals.

SB 707 confirms that agencies may mute and/or remove disruptive individuals from teleconferenced meetings of the Board chair has issued a warning and the disruptive behavior does not promptly cease, effectively treating “Zoom bombers” the same as in-person disruptive individuals.

ORDINANCE NO. 26-02-29

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF THE THREE VALLEYS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT CONCERNING
THE CONDUCT OF ITS PUBLIC MEETINGS**

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Three Valleys Municipal Water District finds as follows:

- A. The Three Valleys Municipal Water District ("the District") is a municipal water district organized and operating pursuant to California Water Code Section 71000 et seq.
- B. The District is governed by an elected Board of Directors ("the Board") whose meetings are subject to the requirements of the Ralph M. Brown Act, California Government Code Section 54950 et seq. ("the Brown Act").
- C. On March 7, 2001, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 3-01-8 in order to clarify and supplement the Brown Act and to ensure that the Board's deliberations and the District's operations are open to the public to the full extent permitted by law.
- D. On May 7, 2001, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 5-01-9 which amended Ordinance No. 3-01-8 to impose further requirements upon itself which allow greater access to the meetings of the Board than prescribed in the Brown Act.
- E. On February 22, 2002, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 02-02-11 which further amended Ordinance No. 3-01-8 with respect to the date, time, and place of the

Board's regular meetings.

F. On June 25, 2003, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 6-03-12 which further amended Ordinance No. 3-01-8 with respect to closed session agenda descriptions and the date, time, and place of the Board's regular meetings.

G. On May 19, 2004, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 05-04-13 which further amended Ordinance No. 3-01-8 with respect to the date, time, and place of the Board's regular meetings, and consolidated all of the amendments to Ordinance No. 3-01-8 into a single comprehensive document.

H. On January 18, 2012, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 12-01-19 which amended Ordinance No. 05-04-13 with respect to the dates of the Board's regular meetings and the posting of its agendas.

I. On April 17, 2013, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 13-04-20 which amended Ordinance No. 12-01-19 with respect to the closed session descriptions attached hereto as Exhibit A so as to maintain compliance with statutory amendments to the Brown Act.

J. On February 17, 2021, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 21-02-22 which amended Ordinance No. 13-04-20 to modify Section 2.3.5 hereof to expand the availability of background material to the public beyond the requirements of Government Code Section 54957.5.

K. On June 15, 2022, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 22-06-23 which amended Ordinance No. 21-02-22 to further modify Section 2.3.5 hereof to incorporate the requirements of Senate Bill 274, which became effective January 1, 2022.

L. On March 1, 2023, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 23-03-25 which amended Ordinance No. 22-06-23 to (1) modify Section 2.3.3 hereof to incorporate requirements of Senate Bill 1100 which became effective January 1, 2023, (2) modify Section 2.3.5 hereof to incorporate requirements of Assembly Bill 2647 which became effective January 1, 2023, and (3) add Section 2.3.6 hereto to assist in compliance with various Brown Act requirements related to remote participation by Board members.

M. On February 21, 2024, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 24-02-26 which amended Ordinance No. 23-03-25 to modify the Board Member Teleconferencing Policy attached as Exhibit B to incorporate requirements of Assembly Bill 557 which became effective January 1, 2024.

N. The purpose of thisOn February 5, 2025, the Board adopted Ordinance isNo. 25-02-28 to (1) modify Section 2.3.6 hereof and the Board Member Teleconferencing Policy attached hereto as Exhibit B to incorporate requirements of Assembly Bill 2302 which became effective January 1, 2025, and (2) modify Exhibit A hereof to incorporate requirements of Assembly Bill 2715 which became effective January 1, 2025, and (3) ensure that the Board's deliberations are performed in a manner that reflect a dedication

~~to the highest standards of integrity and accountability so as to continue to earn the trust and confidence of the parties served by the District.~~

O. The purpose of this Ordinance is to (1) modify Section 2.3.6 hereof and the Board Member Teleconferencing Policy attached hereto as Exhibit B to incorporate requirements of Senate Bill 707 which became effective January 1, 2026, and (2) ensure that the Board's deliberations are performed in a manner that reflect a dedication to the highest standards of integrity and accountability so as to continue to earn the trust and confidence of the parties served by the District.

THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS of the Three Valleys Municipal Water District does hereby adopt and ordain as follows:

Section 1. **COMPLIANCE WITH STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS.**

All meetings of the Board and all committees thereof shall be conducted in compliance with all applicable requirements of the Brown Act.

Section 2. **ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS.**

2.1. **Regular Meetings.** Pursuant to Government Code Section 54954(a), all regular meetings of the Board shall be held at 8:00 a.m. on the first and third Wednesdays of each month at the District offices located at 1021 East Miramar Avenue, Claremont, California, unless otherwise provided in the agenda that is prepared and posted therefor in accordance with Section 2.3 hereof.

2.2. **Special Meetings.** Special meetings of the Board may be called from time to time and will be conducted in accordance with Government Code Section 54956. The Board cannot consider any non-agendized items in a special meeting. Therefore, the agenda for a special meeting shall not include an opportunity for the Board to add any non-agendized items after it is posted.

2.3. **Agendas.**

2.3.1. **Descriptions.** The agenda for all Board meetings and all committee meetings that are open to the public shall contain a brief, general description of each item of business to be transacted or discussed during the meeting and shall avoid the use of undefined abbreviations or acronyms not in common usage and terms whose meaning is not known to the general public. The agendas may refer to explanatory documents, including but not limited to correspondence or reports, within the written material prepared and/or forwarded by District staff to the Board concerning the subject matter of any agenda item. The description of an agenda item is adequate if it is sufficiently clear and specific to alert a person whose interests are affected by the item that he or she may have reason to attend the meeting or seek more information about the item.

2.3.2. **Additions.** The Board shall not discuss or take action on any item not appearing on the posted agenda for the meeting unless otherwise authorized by the Brown Act. All findings and/or determinations required by Government Code Section

54954.2(b) shall be expressly made by the Board and duly reflected in the minutes of the meeting.

2.3.3. Public Comment. The agenda for all meetings of the Board shall include an item for Public Comment so as to provide an express opportunity for members of the public to directly address the Board in accordance with the requirements of Government Code Section 54954.3(a) prior to the Board's consideration of the merits of any item placed on the agenda. In the event that a motion is made to reorder the agenda, or add an item to the agenda, or otherwise take any Board action prior to the Public Comment portion of the agenda, the President of the Board shall ask any members of the public in attendance at the meeting whether they wish to comment on the motion that is pending before the Board. During the Board's consideration of items discussed after the Public Comment portion of the agenda, the President of the Board should exercise best efforts to recognize any member of the public who wishes to speak on that issue prior to any action thereon that is taken by the Board. While testimony and input received from the public during Board meetings is a valuable part of the Board's decision-making process, the Board President is nevertheless authorized pursuant to Government Code Section 54954.3(b) to limit public testimony to three (3) minutes for each individual speaker. The Board President is also authorized pursuant to Government Code Section 54957.95 to remove from a meeting any member of the public whose behavior is

disrupting the meeting, but only after due warning unless the disrupting behavior constitutes a true threat of force.

2.3.4. Posting. The agendas of all Board meetings and all committee meetings which are open to the public shall be posted in the following locations: (1) an exterior bulletin board located outside the District headquarters that is accessible twenty-four (24) hours a day; (2) on-line at the District's website known as www.threevalleys.com; and (3) an interior bulletin board located in the lobby of the District headquarters.

2.3.5. Background Material. Staff material, consisting of agendas, staff reports, and other material prepared and forwarded by staff which provide background information and recommendations, regarding agenda items, when distributed to all or to a majority of the members of the Board in connection with a matter which is subject to discussion or consideration in open session at a public meeting, shall be made readily available to the public on the District's website, at the District's offices, and upon request. If a member of the public requests that a copy of such material be delivered by e-mail, District staff shall e-mail a copy of, or website link to, the documents as requested unless District staff determines that delivery by e-mail or by other electronic means is technologically infeasible, in which case District staff must send the documents by mail in accordance with the mailing requirements of the Brown Act.

2.3.6. Remote Participation. A Board member wishing to participate in a

meeting from a remote location pursuant to Government Code Sections 54953(b), (e), or 54953(fc), 54953.8.2, or 54953.8.3 must notify District staff at the earliest opportunity as soon as possible so that the agenda for the meeting can be prepared and/or amended accordingly and that all other necessary accommodations can be arranged, and the meeting conducted, in a manner generally consistent with the policy attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by this reference.

2.4. **Closed Sessions**

2.4.1. **Agenda Descriptions**. Substantial compliance with the permissive provisions of Government Code Section 54954.5, as generally reflected in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, is mandatory under this Ordinance with respect to the description of any closed session items on any Board meeting agenda. For closed sessions held pursuant to Government Code Section 54957, the agenda will use the description in Exhibit A that best describes the purpose of the closed session. When the purpose of the closed session is to conduct a hearing on specific complaints or charges brought against an employee of the District, the agenda description shall read "PUBLIC EMPLOYEE DISCIPLINE/DISMISSAL/RELEASE, employee given 24-hour notice."

2.4.2. **Advance Announcement**. Prior to holding any closed session, the Board shall state in open session the item or items to be discussed in the closed session.

The statement may take the form of a reference to the item or items as they are listed by number or letter on the agenda, and must include any and all matters otherwise required to be disclosed under the Brown Act. For closed sessions held pursuant to Government Code Section 54956.9(d)(3), the Board must announce the existing facts and circumstances which authorize the holding of the closed session or specifically state that it believes that facts and circumstances that might result in litigation against the District are not yet known to a potential plaintiff or plaintiffs. In the closed session, the Board shall consider only those matters covered in its statement. Nothing in this section shall require or authorize the release of information which is exempt from disclosure under state or federal law.

2.4.3. Public Reports on Closed Session Actions. The Board shall publicly report any action taken in closed session, and the vote or abstention of every member present thereon, in the manner and to the extent required by Government Code Section 54957.1.

2.5. **Ad Hoc Committees.** In order to be exempt from the notice, agenda, and public participation requirements of the Brown Act, all ad hoc committees of the Board shall substantially comply with the following guidelines: (1) The committee shall be comprised of less than a quorum of the Board; (2) The committee's life should be restricted to a relatively short period of time; (3) The committee's purpose should be

limited to a single and specific task; (4) The committee shall not be given any independent discretionary authority to make ultimate decisions on behalf of the Board with respect to the final resolution of the task; (5) The committee's charge should not be automatically renewed upon completion of its particular assignment or expiration of its fixed term; (6) The committee's meeting schedule should not be on a regular basis or established by formal action of the Board; and (7) Public notice of the formation of the committee shall be given in a timely manner.

Section 3. **REVIEW OF ORDINANCE ON ANNUAL BASIS.**

Each year, the Board may review this Ordinance to determine its effectiveness and the necessity for its continued operation. As such time, the District's General Manager shall report to the Board on the operation of this Ordinance, and make any recommendations deemed appropriate, including proposals to amend the Ordinance. Upon conclusion of its review, the Board may take any action it deems appropriate concerning this Ordinance. Nothing herein shall preclude the Board from taking action on the Ordinance at times other than upon conclusion of the annual review. The Board's failure to conduct the annual review shall result in the continued operation of this Ordinance for another year or until otherwise modified by the Board.

Section 4. **SEVERABILITY.**

If any provision of this Ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or

circumstance, is held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

Section 5. **EFFECTIVE DATE.**

The provisions of this Ordinance shall supersede all prior inconsistent ordinances and shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

EXHIBIT B**Board Member Teleconferencing Policy****Article I. Policy:**

The policy set forth herein ("Policy") shall govern the Agency's use of Teleconferencing for participation at Meetings of the Members of its Legislative Bodies. The Global Teleconferencing Policies (Article III) and Standard Teleconferencing Procedures (Article IV) shall apply in all instances, except when (1) a Member has a Disability requiring Reasonable Accommodation Procedures (Article V), or (2) a Member has either "just cause" or an "emergency circumstance" so as to permit the use of the Expanded Teleconferencing Procedures (Article VI), or (23) a State of Emergency issued by the California Governor or Local Emergency is in effect sufficient to trigger the use of the Emergency Teleconferencing Procedures (Article VII).

Article II. Definitions:

Unless otherwise defined herein, the following definitions shall apply to this Policy:

Ad Hoc Committee – shall refer to a Legislative Body of the Agency that satisfies the guidelines described in Section 2.5 of the underlying Ordinance hereof.

Agency – shall refer to the Three Valleys Municipal Water District.

Board – shall refer to the Agency's Board of Directors.

Brown Act / Ralph M. Brown Act – shall refer to Chapter 9 (commencing with Section 54950) of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5 of the California Government Code, known as the "Ralph M. Brown Act" pursuant to Government Code section 54950.5, as such shall be amended from time to time.

Disability – shall have the same meaning as provided by Government Code Section 54953(e)(1).

Legislative Body – shall have the same meaning as provided by Government Code Section 54952, including the Board, Standing Committees, and Ad Hoc Committees.

Local Emergency – shall refer to a condition of extreme peril to persons or property within the boundaries of the Agency proclaimed by the governing body of the local agency affected in accordance with Government Code Section 54953.8.2(e)(1).

Member – shall have the same meaning as provided by Government Code Section 54952.1.

Meeting – shall have the same meaning as provided by Government Code Section 54952.2.

Standing Committee – shall refer to a Legislative Body of the Agency comprised of less than a quorum of the Board that is not an Ad Hoc Committee.

State – shall mean the State of California.

State of Emergency – shall mean a state of emergency proclaimed by the California Governor or such others as may be empowered pursuant to Section 8625 of the California Emergency Services Act, as set forth in Article 1 (commencing with Section 8550) of Chapter 7 of Division 1 of Title 2 of the California Government Code.

Teleconferencing – attendance from different locations, other than the physical location of a meeting, by way of an audio device, whether it be telephone, audio-only internet connection, or otherwise.

Videoconferencing – attendance from different locations, other than the physical location of a meeting, by way of a dual audio and visual device, whereby participants can be both seen and heard. For purposes of this Policy, Videoconferencing may include attendance by way of a single device or software package, or attendance via an audio-device with synced camera or webcasting.

Article III. Global Teleconferencing Policies:

At the discretion of the Legislative Body and/or the Agency's General Manager, any employee, consultant, vendor, or individual presenting or attending a Meeting of a Legislative Body, other than a Member of the Legislative Body, shall be permitted to attend and participate via teleconference or videoconference without compliance with the rules or conditions set forth herein. Members of the Legislative Body may only participate via teleconference or videoconference as permitted by this Policy.

To the extent a Member desires to participate in a Meeting via teleconference or videoconference, the Member shall generally be required to comply with the foregoing "Standard Teleconferencing Procedures" (Article IV) unless the circumstances exist to justify the use of the "Reasonable Accommodation Procedures" (Article V), "Expanded Teleconferencing Procedures" (Article VI), or "Emergency Teleconferencing Procedures" (Article VII).

In all instances in which a Member is participating in a Meeting via Teleconferencing or Videoconferencing, the Legislative Body shall:

1. Take all votes by roll-call;
2. Conduct the Meeting in a manner that protects the statutory and constitutional rights of the parties and public appearing before the Legislative Body;
3. Provide notice and post agendas as otherwise required by the Brown Act; and
4. Permit members of the public access to the Meeting and an opportunity to address the Legislative Body as required by the Brown Act.

Article IV. Standard Teleconferencing Procedures:

A Member may participate in a Meeting via Teleconferencing or Videoconferencing if the following conditions are satisfied:

1. At least a quorum of the Members of the Legislative Body participate in the Meeting from locations within the boundaries of the Agency;
2. The agenda posted for the Meeting is posted at all teleconference locations, each of which are identified in the notice and the agenda for the Meeting; and
3. Each teleconference location is accessible to the public, and the public is permitted to comment at each teleconference location.

Article V. Reasonable Accommodation Procedures for Members with Disabilities:

A Member with a Disability may participate in a Meeting via Teleconferencing or Videoconferencing, without the need to comply with the Standard Teleconference Procedure requirements to notice and post at the agenda location or make such locations accessible to the public, as a reasonable accommodation pursuant to applicable law as follows:

1. The Member shall participate through both Videoconferencing and Teleconferencing, except that a Member may participate only by Teleconference if a physical condition related to the Disability results in a need to participate off camera; and
2. The Member shall disclose at the Meeting before any action is taken, whether any individuals 18 years of age or older are present in the room at the remote location with the Member, and the general nature of the Member's relationship with any of those individuals.

Article VI. Expanded Teleconferencing Procedures (Effective Thru January 1, 202630):

A Member may participate in a Meeting via videoconference only (Teleconferencing will not be permitted under these procedures), without the need to comply with the Standard Teleconference Procedure requirements to notice and post at the agenda locations or make such locations accessible to the public, if the following conditions are satisfied:

1. At least a quorum of the Members of the Legislative Body participate in-person from a single physical location accessible to the public, which is within the boundaries of the Agency and clearly identified in the posted agenda;
2. The public is permitted to attend the Meeting either by teleconference or videoconference in a manner such that the public can remotely attend and offer real-time comment during the Meeting;
3. Notice of the means by which the public can remotely attend the Meeting via teleconference or videoconference and offer comment during the Meeting is included within the posted agenda;
4. The Member attending remotely has either "just cause" or an "emergency circumstance" that justifies the Member's attendance via videoconference.
 - a. A Member shall only have "just cause" for remote attendance if such participation is for one of the following reasons:

- i. To provide childcare or caregiving need to a child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, sibling, spouse, or domestic partner, with such terms having the same meaning as those terms are defined in Government Code Section 12945.2;
- ii. Due to a contagious illness that prevents the Member from attending in-person;
- iii. Due to a need related to a physical or mental disability as defined in Government Code Sections 12926 and 12926.1 not otherwise accommodated; and
- iv. Due to travel while on official business of the Legislative Body or another state or local agency;
- v. Due to an immunocompromised child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, sibling, spouse, or domestic partner of the Member that requires the Member to participate remotely;
- vi. A physical or family emergency that prevents the Member from attending in person; and
- iv.vii. Military service obligations that result in the Member being unable to attend in person because the Member is serving under official orders for active duty, drill, annual training, or any other duty required as a member of the California National Guard or a United States Military Reserve organization that requires the Member to be at least 50 miles outside the boundaries of the Agency.

b. A Member shall have an "emergency circumstance" if such participation is due to a physical or family medical emergency that prevents the Member from attending in person. The minutes for the Meeting shall identify the specific provision under Article VI.4.a. above that the Member relied upon to participate remotely.

5. The Member has not attended a Meeting remotely on the basis of "just cause" for more than two Meetings in the current calendar year;

6.5. The Member has not attended a Meeting remotely on the basis of "just cause" or "emergency circumstance" for more than five Meetings in the current calendar year; and

7.6. The Legislative Body has, and has implemented, a procedure for receiving and swiftly resolving requests for reasonable accommodation for individuals with disabilities, consistent with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. Sec. 12132), and resolving any doubt in favor of accessibility. In each instance in which notice of the time of the Meeting is otherwise given or the agenda for the Meeting is otherwise posted, the Legislative Body shall also give notice of the procedure for receiving and resolving requests for accommodation.

8.7. The numerical limitations set forth in Article V.5. above do not apply if a Member's reason for remote participation at a Meeting is due to "just cause" grounds that relate to a physical or mental disability under Article V.4.a.iii. herein which qualifies for reasonable accommodation pursuant to the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. Sec. 12132).

In order to utilize the Expanded Teleconference Procedures, a Member shall:

1. For a "just cause" circumstance, notify the Legislative Body at the earliest opportunity, including at the start of a regular Meeting, of their need to participate remotely for just cause, including a general description of the circumstance relating to their need to appear remotely at the given Meeting;
2. ~~For an "emergency circumstance," request to participate at a Meeting due to an "emergency circumstance" as soon as possible, preferably before the posting of the agenda but up to the start of the Meeting, with such request including a general description of the circumstances relating to their need to appear remotely at the given Meeting, though any description for emergency circumstances need not exceed 20 words and need not include any medical diagnosis or disability or personal medical information exempt from disclosure by law;~~
3. The Member shall publicly disclose at the Meeting before any action is taken, whether any other individuals 18 years of age or older are present in the room at the remote location with the Member, and the general nature of the Member's relationship with such individuals; and
4. Participate through Videoconferencing, with both audio and visual technology.

Upon receipt of ~~a request notice~~ from a Member to utilize the Expanded Teleconference Procedure, the Legislative Body shall: ~~in the event of a disruption that prevents the broadcast of the Meeting to members of the public, or in the event of a disruption within the Agency's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comment using the Teleconferencing or Videoconferencing options, take no further action during a Meeting until such access is restored.~~

1. ~~Take action by majority vote on a request to participate remotely due to an "emergency circumstance" at its earliest opportunity, which may be taken as a noticed agenda item or as an added item if sufficient time was not provided to place the proposed action on the agenda; and~~
2. ~~In the event of a disruption that prevents the broadcast of the Meeting to members of the public, or in the event of a disruption within the Agency's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comment using the Teleconferencing or Videoconferencing options, take no further action during a Meeting until such access is restored.~~

Article VII. Emergency Teleconferencing Procedures:

Notwithstanding the Standard Teleconferencing Procedures, a Legislative Body may elect to use these "Emergency Teleconferencing Procedures" to allow Teleconferencing if any of the following circumstances apply:

1. The Legislative Body holds a Meeting during a proclaimed State of Emergency ~~or Local Emergency~~ for the purpose of determining, by majority vote, whether as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees; or

2. The Legislative Body holds a Meeting during a proclaimed State of Emergency or Local Emergency and the Legislative Body has determined, by majority vote, that as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health and safety of attendees.

If utilizing the Emergency Teleconferencing Procedures, the Legislative Body shall:

1. Give notice in the agenda for such Meeting of the means by which members of the public may access the Meeting and offer public comment via a Teleconferencing or Videoconferencing option, which shall include an opportunity for public comment in real-time;
2. In the event of a disruption that prevents the broadcast of the Meeting to members of the public, or in the event of a disruption within the Agency's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comment using the Teleconferencing or Videoconferencing options, take no further action during a Meeting until such access is restored; and
3. Not close the public comment period, or the opportunity to register to comment, until the time that the general public comment period has elapsed.

The Legislative Body may continue use of the Emergency Teleconferencing Procedures for as long as the State of Emergency or Local Emergency remains active, provided that, not later than 45 days after Teleconferencing for the first time, and every 45 days thereafter, the Legislative Body finds by majority vote that:

1. The Legislative Body has reconsidered the circumstances of the State of Emergency or Local Emergency; and
2. The State of Emergency or Local Emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the Members to meet safely in person.

In the event of the use of these Emergency Teleconferencing Procedures, it shall not be necessary for the Agency to provide a physical location from which the public may attend or comment.

Article VII. Miscellaneous Teleconferencing Provisions:

With respect to the Standard Teleconferencing Procedures, Expanded Teleconferencing Procedures, and Emergency Teleconferencing Procedures set forth herein, such are intended to comply with Government Code Sections 54953(b), (f), and 54953(ec), 54953.8.3, and 54953.8.2, respectively, and, as such, in the event of a conflict between this Policy and such statutory provisions, the statutory provisions shall control and be implemented as if set forth in full in this Policy.

ORDINANCE NO. 26-02-29

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF THE THREE VALLEYS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT CONCERNING
THE CONDUCT OF ITS PUBLIC MEETINGS**

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Three Valleys Municipal Water District finds as follows:

- A. The Three Valleys Municipal Water District ("the District") is a municipal water district organized and operating pursuant to California Water Code Section 71000 et seq.
- B. The District is governed by an elected Board of Directors ("the Board") whose meetings are subject to the requirements of the Ralph M. Brown Act, California Government Code Section 54950 et seq. ("the Brown Act").
- C. On March 7, 2001, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 3-01-8 in order to clarify and supplement the Brown Act and to ensure that the Board's deliberations and the District's operations are open to the public to the full extent permitted by law.
- D. On May 7, 2001, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 5-01-9 which amended Ordinance No. 3-01-8 to impose further requirements upon itself which allow greater access to the meetings of the Board than prescribed in the Brown Act.
- E. On February 22, 2002, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 02-02-11 which further amended Ordinance No. 3-01-8 with respect to the date, time, and place of the

Board's regular meetings.

F. On June 25, 2003, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 6-03-12 which further amended Ordinance No. 3-01-8 with respect to closed session agenda descriptions and the date, time, and place of the Board's regular meetings.

G. On May 19, 2004, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 05-04-13 which further amended Ordinance No. 3-01-8 with respect to the date, time, and place of the Board's regular meetings, and consolidated all of the amendments to Ordinance No. 3-01-8 into a single comprehensive document.

H. On January 18, 2012, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 12-01-19 which amended Ordinance No. 05-04-13 with respect to the dates of the Board's regular meetings and the posting of its agendas.

I. On April 17, 2013, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 13-04-20 which amended Ordinance No. 12-01-19 with respect to the closed session descriptions attached hereto as Exhibit A so as to maintain compliance with statutory amendments to the Brown Act.

J. On February 17, 2021, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 21-02-22 which amended Ordinance No. 13-04-20 to modify Section 2.3.5 hereof to expand the availability of background material to the public beyond the requirements of Government Code Section 54957.5.

K. On June 15, 2022, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 22-06-23 which amended Ordinance No. 21-02-22 to further modify Section 2.3.5 hereof to incorporate the requirements of Senate Bill 274, which became effective January 1, 2022.

L. On March 1, 2023, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 23-03-25 which amended Ordinance No. 22-06-23 to (1) modify Section 2.3.3 hereof to incorporate requirements of Senate Bill 1100 which became effective January 1, 2023, (2) modify Section 2.3.5 hereof to incorporate requirements of Assembly Bill 2647 which became effective January 1, 2023, and (3) add Section 2.3.6 hereto to assist in compliance with various Brown Act requirements related to remote participation by Board members.

M. On February 21, 2024, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 24-02-26 which amended Ordinance No. 23-03-25 to modify the Board Member Teleconferencing Policy attached as Exhibit B to incorporate requirements of Assembly Bill 557 which became effective January 1, 2024.

N. On February 5, 2025, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 25-02-28 to (1) modify Section 2.3.6 hereof and the Board Member Teleconferencing Policy attached hereto as Exhibit B to incorporate requirements of Assembly Bill 2302 which became effective January 1, 2025, and (2) modify Exhibit A hereof to incorporate requirements of Assembly Bill 2715 which became effective January 1, 2025.

O. The purpose of this Ordinance is to (1) modify Section 2.3.6 hereof and the

Board Member Teleconferencing Policy attached hereto as Exhibit B to incorporate requirements of Senate Bill 707 which became effective January 1, 2026, and (2) ensure that the Board's deliberations are performed in a manner that reflect a dedication to the highest standards of integrity and accountability so as to continue to earn the trust and confidence of the parties served by the District.

THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS of the Three Valleys Municipal Water District does hereby adopt and ordain as follows:

Section 1. **COMPLIANCE WITH STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS.**

All meetings of the Board and all committees thereof shall be conducted in compliance with all applicable requirements of the Brown Act.

Section 2. **ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS.**

2.1. **Regular Meetings.** Pursuant to Government Code Section 54954(a), all regular meetings of the Board shall be held at 8:00 a.m. on the first and third Wednesdays of each month at the District offices located at 1021 East Miramar Avenue, Claremont, California, unless otherwise provided in the agenda that is prepared and posted therefor in accordance with Section 2.3 hereof.

2.2. **Special Meetings.** Special meetings of the Board may be called from time to time and will be conducted in accordance with Government Code Section 54956. The Board cannot consider any non-agendized items in a special meeting. Therefore, the

agenda for a special meeting shall not include an opportunity for the Board to add any non-agendized items after it is posted.

2.3. **Agendas.**

2.3.1. **Descriptions.** The agenda for all Board meetings and all committee meetings that are open to the public shall contain a brief, general description of each item of business to be transacted or discussed during the meeting and shall avoid the use of undefined abbreviations or acronyms not in common usage and terms whose meaning is not known to the general public. The agendas may refer to explanatory documents, including but not limited to correspondence or reports, within the written material prepared and/or forwarded by District staff to the Board concerning the subject matter of any agenda item. The description of an agenda item is adequate if it is sufficiently clear and specific to alert a person whose interests are affected by the item that he or she may have reason to attend the meeting or seek more information about the item.

2.3.2. **Additions.** The Board shall not discuss or take action on any item not appearing on the posted agenda for the meeting unless otherwise authorized by the Brown Act. All findings and/or determinations required by Government Code Section 54954.2(b) shall be expressly made by the Board and duly reflected in the minutes of the meeting.

2.3.3. **Public Comment.** The agenda for all meetings of the Board shall

include an item for Public Comment so as to provide an express opportunity for members of the public to directly address the Board in accordance with the requirements of Government Code Section 54954.3(a) prior to the Board's consideration of the merits of any item placed on the agenda. In the event that a motion is made to reorder the agenda, or add an item to the agenda, or otherwise take any Board action prior to the Public Comment portion of the agenda, the President of the Board shall ask any members of the public in attendance at the meeting whether they wish to comment on the motion that is pending before the Board. During the Board's consideration of items discussed after the Public Comment portion of the agenda, the President of the Board should exercise best efforts to recognize any member of the public who wishes to speak on that issue prior to any action thereon that is taken by the Board. While testimony and input received from the public during Board meetings is a valuable part of the Board's decision-making process, the Board President is nevertheless authorized pursuant to Government Code Section 54954.3(b) to limit public testimony to three (3) minutes for each individual speaker. The Board President is also authorized pursuant to Government Code Section 54957.95 to remove from a meeting any member of the public whose behavior is disrupting the meeting, but only after due warning unless the disrupting behavior constitutes a true threat of force.

2.3.4. Posting. The agendas of all Board meetings and all committee

meetings which are open to the public shall be posted in the following locations: (1) an exterior bulletin board located outside the District headquarters that is accessible twenty-four (24) hours a day; (2) on-line at the District's website known as www.threevalleys.com; and (3) an interior bulletin board located in the lobby of the District headquarters.

2.3.5. Background Material. Staff material, consisting of agendas, staff reports, and other material prepared and forwarded by staff which provide background information and recommendations, regarding agenda items, when distributed to all or to a majority of the members of the Board in connection with a matter which is subject to discussion or consideration in open session at a public meeting, shall be made readily available to the public on the District's website, at the District's offices, and upon request. If a member of the public requests that a copy of such material be delivered by e-mail, District staff shall e-mail a copy of, or website link to, the documents as requested unless District staff determines that delivery by e-mail or by other electronic means is technologically infeasible, in which case District staff must send the documents by mail in accordance with the mailing requirements of the Brown Act.

2.3.6. Remote Participation. A Board member wishing to participate in a meeting from a remote location pursuant to Government Code Sections 54953(b), 54953(c), 54953.8.2, or 54953.8.3 must notify District staff at the earliest opportunity as soon as possible so that the agenda for the meeting can be prepared and/or amended

accordingly and that all other necessary accommodations can be arranged, and the meeting conducted, in a manner generally consistent with the policy attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by this reference.

2.4. **Closed Sessions**

2.4.1. Agenda Descriptions. Substantial compliance with the permissive provisions of Government Code Section 54954.5, as generally reflected in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, is mandatory under this Ordinance with respect to the description of any closed session items on any Board meeting agenda. For closed sessions held pursuant to Government Code Section 54957, the agenda will use the description in Exhibit A that best describes the purpose of the closed session. When the purpose of the closed session is to conduct a hearing on specific complaints or charges brought against an employee of the District, the agenda description shall read "PUBLIC EMPLOYEE DISCIPLINE/DISMISSAL/RELEASE, employee given 24-hour notice."

2.4.2. Advance Announcement. Prior to holding any closed session, the Board shall state in open session the item or items to be discussed in the closed session. The statement may take the form of a reference to the item or items as they are listed by number or letter on the agenda, and must include any and all matters otherwise required to be disclosed under the Brown Act. For closed sessions held pursuant to Government

Code Section 54956.9(d)(3), the Board must announce the existing facts and circumstances which authorize the holding of the closed session or specifically state that it believes that facts and circumstances that might result in litigation against the District are not yet known to a potential plaintiff or plaintiffs. In the closed session, the Board shall consider only those matters covered in its statement. Nothing in this section shall require or authorize the release of information which is exempt from disclosure under state or federal law.

2.4.3. Public Reports on Closed Session Actions. The Board shall publicly report any action taken in closed session, and the vote or abstention of every member present thereon, in the manner and to the extent required by Government Code Section 54957.1.

2.5. **Ad Hoc Committees.** In order to be exempt from the notice, agenda, and public participation requirements of the Brown Act, all ad hoc committees of the Board shall substantially comply with the following guidelines: (1) The committee shall be comprised of less than a quorum of the Board; (2) The committee's life should be restricted to a relatively short period of time; (3) The committee's purpose should be limited to a single and specific task; (4) The committee shall not be given any independent discretionary authority to make ultimate decisions on behalf of the Board with respect to the final resolution of the task; (5) The committee's charge should not be automatically

renewed upon completion of its particular assignment or expiration of its fixed term; (6) The committee's meeting schedule should not be on a regular basis or established by formal action of the Board; and (7) Public notice of the formation of the committee shall be given in a timely manner.

Section 3. **REVIEW OF ORDINANCE ON ANNUAL BASIS.**

Each year, the Board may review this Ordinance to determine its effectiveness and the necessity for its continued operation. As such time, the District's General Manager shall report to the Board on the operation of this Ordinance, and make any recommendations deemed appropriate, including proposals to amend the Ordinance. Upon conclusion of its review, the Board may take any action it deems appropriate concerning this Ordinance. Nothing herein shall preclude the Board from taking action on the Ordinance at times other than upon conclusion of the annual review. The Board's failure to conduct the annual review shall result in the continued operation of this Ordinance for another year or until otherwise modified by the Board.

Section 4. **SEVERABILITY.**

If any provision of this Ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

Section 5. **EFFECTIVE DATE.**

The provisions of this Ordinance shall supersede all prior inconsistent ordinances and shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

EXHIBIT B**Board Member Teleconferencing Policy****Article I. Policy:**

The policy set forth herein ("Policy") shall govern the Agency's use of Teleconferencing for participation at Meetings of the Members of its Legislative Bodies. The Global Teleconferencing Policies (Article III) and Standard Teleconferencing Procedures (Article IV) shall apply in all instances, except when (1) a Member has a Disability requiring Reasonable Accommodation Procedures (Article V), or (2) a Member has "just cause" so as to permit the use of the Expanded Teleconferencing Procedures (Article VI), or (3) a State of Emergency or Local Emergency is in effect sufficient to trigger the use of the Emergency Teleconferencing Procedures (Article VII).

Article II. Definitions:

Unless otherwise defined herein, the following definitions shall apply to this Policy:

Ad Hoc Committee – shall refer to a Legislative Body of the Agency that satisfies the guidelines described in Section 2.5 of the underlying Ordinance hereof.

Agency – shall refer to the Three Valleys Municipal Water District.

Board – shall refer to the Agency's Board of Directors.

Brown Act / Ralph M. Brown Act – shall refer to Chapter 9 (commencing with Section 54950) of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5 of the California Government Code, known as the "Ralph M. Brown Act" pursuant to Government Code section 54950.5, as such shall be amended from time to time.

Disability – shall have the same meaning as provided by Government Code Section 54953(e)(1).

Legislative Body – shall have the same meaning as provided by Government Code Section 54952, including the Board, Standing Committees, and Ad Hoc Committees.

Local Emergency – shall refer to a condition of extreme peril to persons or property within the boundaries of the Agency proclaimed by the governing body of the local agency affected in accordance with Government Code Section 54953.8.2(e)(1).

Member – shall have the same meaning as provided by Government Code Section 54952.1.

Meeting – shall have the same meaning as provided by Government Code Section 54952.2.

Standing Committee – shall refer to a Legislative Body of the Agency comprised of less than a quorum of the Board that is not an Ad Hoc Committee.

State – shall mean the State of California.

State of Emergency – shall mean a state of emergency proclaimed by the California Governor or such others as may be empowered pursuant to Section 8625 of the California Emergency Services Act, as set forth in Article 1 (commencing with Section 8550) of Chapter 7 of Division 1 of Title 2 of the California Government Code.

Teleconferencing – attendance from different locations, other than the physical location of a meeting, by way of an audio device, whether it be telephone, audio-only internet connection, or otherwise.

Videoconferencing – attendance from different locations, other than the physical location of a meeting, by way of a dual audio and visual device, whereby participants can be both seen and heard. For purposes of this Policy, Videoconferencing may include attendance by way of a single device or software package, or attendance via an audio-device with synced camera or webcasting.

Article III. Global Teleconferencing Policies:

At the discretion of the Legislative Body and/or the Agency's General Manager, any employee, consultant, vendor, or individual presenting or attending a Meeting of a Legislative Body, other than a Member of the Legislative Body, shall be permitted to attend and participate via teleconference or videoconference without compliance with the rules or conditions set forth herein. Members of the Legislative Body may only participate via teleconference or videoconference as permitted by this Policy.

To the extent a Member desires to participate in a Meeting via teleconference or videoconference, the Member shall generally be required to comply with the foregoing "Standard Teleconferencing Procedures" (Article IV) unless the circumstances exist to justify the use of the "Reasonable Accommodation Procedures" (Article V), "Expanded Teleconferencing Procedures" (Article VI), or "Emergency Teleconferencing Procedures" (Article VII).

In all instances in which a Member is participating in a Meeting via Teleconferencing or Videoconferencing, the Legislative Body shall:

1. Take all votes by roll-call;
2. Conduct the Meeting in a manner that protects the statutory and constitutional rights of the parties and public appearing before the Legislative Body;
3. Provide notice and post agendas as otherwise required by the Brown Act; and
4. Permit members of the public access to the Meeting and an opportunity to address the Legislative Body as required by the Brown Act.

Article IV. Standard Teleconferencing Procedures:

A Member may participate in a Meeting via Teleconferencing or Videoconferencing if the following conditions are satisfied:

1. At least a quorum of the Members of the Legislative Body participate in the Meeting from locations within the boundaries of the Agency;
2. The agenda posted for the Meeting is posted at all teleconference locations, each of which are identified in the notice and the agenda for the Meeting; and
3. Each teleconference location is accessible to the public, and the public is permitted to comment at each teleconference location.

Article V. Reasonable Accommodation Procedures for Members with Disabilities:

A Member with a Disability may participate in a Meeting via Teleconferencing or Videoconferencing, without the need to comply with the Standard Teleconference Procedure requirements to notice and post at the agenda location or make such locations accessible to the public, as a reasonable accommodation pursuant to applicable law as follows:

1. The Member shall participate through both Videoconferencing and Teleconferencing, except that a Member may participate only by Teleconference if a physical condition related to the Disability results in a need to participate off camera; and
2. The Member shall disclose at the Meeting before any action is taken, whether any individuals 18 years of age or older are present in the room at the remote location with the Member, and the general nature of the Member's relationship with any of those individuals.

Article VI. Expanded Teleconferencing Procedures (Effective Thru January 1, 2030):

A Member may participate in a Meeting via videoconference only (Teleconferencing will not be permitted under these procedures), without the need to comply with the Standard Teleconference Procedure requirements to notice and post at the agenda locations or make such locations accessible to the public, if the following conditions are satisfied:

1. At least a quorum of the Members of the Legislative Body participate in-person from a single physical location accessible to the public, which is within the boundaries of the Agency and clearly identified in the posted agenda;
2. The public is permitted to attend the Meeting either by teleconference or videoconference in a manner such that the public can remotely attend and offer real-time comment during the Meeting;
3. Notice of the means by which the public can remotely attend the Meeting via teleconference or videoconference and offer comment during the Meeting is included within the posted agenda;
4. The Member attending remotely has "just cause" that justifies the Member's attendance via videoconference.
 - a. A Member shall only have "just cause" for remote attendance if such participation is for one of the following reasons:

- i. To provide childcare or caregiving need to a child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, sibling, spouse, or domestic partner, with such terms having the same meaning as those terms are defined in Government Code Section 12945.2;
- ii. Due to a contagious illness that prevents the Member from attending in-person;
- iii. Due to a need related to a physical or mental disability as defined in Government Code Sections 12926 and 12926.1 not otherwise accommodated;
- iv. Due to travel while on official business of the Legislative Body or another state or local agency;
- v. Due to an immunocompromised child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, sibling, spouse, or domestic partner of the Member that requires the Member to participate remotely;
- vi. A physical or family emergency that prevents the Member from attending in person; and
- vii. Military service obligations that result in the Member being unable to attend in person because the Member is serving under official orders for active duty, drill, annual training, or any other duty required as a member of the California National Guard or a United States Military Reserve organization that requires the Member to be at least 50 miles outside the boundaries of the Agency.

- b. The minutes for the Meeting shall identify the specific provision under Article VI.4.a. above that the Member relied upon to participate remotely.

- 5. The Member has not attended a Meeting remotely on the basis of "just cause" for more than five Meetings in the current calendar year; and
- 6. The Legislative Body has, and has implemented, a procedure for receiving and swiftly resolving requests for reasonable accommodation for individuals with disabilities, consistent with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. Sec. 12132), and resolving any doubt in favor of accessibility. In each instance in which notice of the time of the Meeting is otherwise given or the agenda for the Meeting is otherwise posted, the Legislative Body shall also give notice of the procedure for receiving and resolving requests for accommodation.

In order to utilize the Expanded Teleconference Procedures, a Member shall:

- 1. For a "just cause" circumstance, notify the Legislative Body at the earliest opportunity, including at the start of a regular Meeting, of their need to participate remotely for just cause, including a general description of the circumstance relating to their need to appear remotely at the given Meeting;
- 2.
- 3. The Member shall publicly disclose at the Meeting before any action is taken, whether any other individuals 18 years of age or older are present in the room at the remote location with the Member, and the general nature of the Member's relationship with such individuals; and

4. Participate through Videoconferencing, with both audio and visual technology.

Upon receipt of notice from a Member to utilize the Expanded Teleconference Procedure, the Legislative Body shall, in the event of a disruption that prevents the broadcast of the Meeting to members of the public, or in the event of a disruption within the Agency's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comment using the Teleconferencing or Videoconferencing options, take no further action during a Meeting until such access is restored.

Article VII. Emergency Teleconferencing Procedures:

Notwithstanding the Standard Teleconferencing Procedures, a Legislative Body may elect to use these "Emergency Teleconferencing Procedures" to allow Teleconferencing if any of the following circumstances apply:

1. The Legislative Body holds a Meeting during a proclaimed State of Emergency or Local Emergency for the purpose of determining, by majority vote, whether as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees; or
2. The Legislative Body holds a Meeting during a proclaimed State of Emergency or Local Emergency and the Legislative Body has determined, by majority vote, that as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health and safety of attendees.

If utilizing the Emergency Teleconferencing Procedures, the Legislative Body shall:

1. Give notice in the agenda for such Meeting of the means by which members of the public may access the Meeting and offer public comment via a Teleconferencing or Videoconferencing option, which shall include an opportunity for public comment in real-time;
2. In the event of a disruption that prevents the broadcast of the Meeting to members of the public, or in the event of a disruption within the Agency's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comment using the Teleconferencing or Videoconferencing options, take no further action during a Meeting until such access is restored; and
3. Not close the public comment period, or the opportunity to register to comment, until the time that the general public comment period has elapsed.

The Legislative Body may continue use of the Emergency Teleconferencing Procedures for as long as the State of Emergency or Local Emergency remains active, provided that, not later than 45 days after Teleconferencing for the first time, and every 45 days thereafter, the Legislative Body finds by majority vote that:

1. The Legislative Body has reconsidered the circumstances of the State of Emergency or Local Emergency; and
2. The State of Emergency or Local Emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the Members to meet safely in person.

In the event of the use of these Emergency Teleconferencing Procedures, it shall not be necessary for the Agency to provide a physical location from which the public may attend or comment.

Article VIII. Miscellaneous Teleconferencing Provisions:

With respect to the Standard Teleconferencing Procedures, Expanded Teleconferencing Procedures, and Emergency Teleconferencing Procedures set forth herein, such are intended to comply with Government Code Sections 54953(b), 54953(c), 54953.8.3, and 54953.8.2, respectively, and, as such, in the event of a conflict between this Policy and such statutory provisions, the statutory provisions shall control and be implemented as if set forth in full in this Policy.
